"And Moses went out towards his father-in-law, and he bowed to him, and he kissed him, and they greeted each other in peace, and they came to the tent." (18:7)

Rabbeinu Ovadiah Sforno points out that evil people have a tendency to rely on others in times of need and then to forget them once they become successful. Thus, we find Pharaoh's imprisoned cupbearer conveniently forgetting Joseph, (who had correctly interpreted his dreams) as soon as he was released from prison (see Bereishis 40:23).

Righteous people, on the other hand, never forget the people who help them, even when they reach the pinnacles of good fortune. Joseph did not reject his brothers after he became viceroy (see Bereishis 50:15-21), and Esther continued to follow the instructions and advice of Mordechai even after becoming queen over one hundred and twenty seven provinces (see Esther 2:20).

This was how Moses conducted himself, as well. Even after rising to a high station and becoming the leader of the Jewish people, he remembered his father-in-law, who gave him shelter when he first arrived to Midian. He thus went out to greet him with the greatest honor.
