"And he called to Moshe and G-d spoke to him" (1:1)

The Midrash (Vayikra Rabba) notes that Moshe had ten names, yet G-d chose to call him as Moshe, using the name that he had been given by Batya, daughter of Pharaoh. Why would G-d specifically choose to address Moshe using this name? Does it express spiritual greatness better than his other names? Moreover, his other names are all expressions of his elevated status; for example he was called Yered because he brought the Torah down to Israel.

The name Moshe, on the other hand, has nothing to do with his character traits or achievements, but refers to the person who gave him the name, as the verse (Shemos 2:10) states: "and she called him Moshe and she said, for I have drawn him from the water."

Rav Chaim Shmulevits, z"l, offers the following insight. Indeed he was called Moshe because Batya said, "I have drawn him from the water." What Batya did should not be downplayed; her act demanded a great measure of self-sacrifice. It was her father, Pharaoh, who had decreed that all male Hebrews were to be drowned; yet, she willfully violated that decree when she reached out and saved Moshe!

This supreme act of self-sacrifice permeated Moshe's body and soul, becoming an intrinsic part of him. The very source of Moshe's power of self-sacrifice was Batya. It is thus understandable why G-d, as it were, would choose to call to Moshe using this name, for it reflects and expresses his basic quality. It was through this trait of self-sacrifice that Moshe merited to rise to all of the other high levels that he reached.
